PRESENTATION OF RESULTS


The results presented in this chapter will be divided into two parts. The first part is the results of the Lomantic Differential Rest, presented in graph form, which shows the male and female subjects' image of sex, love, dating, poyiriond or girlfriend, love and marriage. The second part consists of the responses of the male and female subjects to the questions on the topics stated in Chapter II.


Figure 1 to Figure 5 presents the images of sex, dating, boyfriend or girlfriend, love and merriage as perceived by the male and female subjects. As is soon in Figure 1, both cals end femals subjects Scherelly perceive sex in a positive way; the male subjects here a tendency to perceive it more positively then the female subjects do. Heny scales were judged as neutral by the femalo euojects. Figure 2 shows that the mole and female subjects perceive dating in a positive may too and the male oubjects, generally, perceive it more positively than the female subjects do. And in Figure 3, both sale and ferale subjects perceive beginiend or girlfriend in a positive any and they have a tondency to perceive it similarly. As is seen in Figure 4. both male and fomule subjects percoive love so positive and have s tendency to perceive it positively to the seme degree. Pigure 5, the uslo and fougle subjects, generally, perceive marriage in a positive manner and they have a tendency to percoive it as positive to the same degree.

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presented above, it can be said that both male and female subjects perceive sex, dating, boyfriend or girlfriend, love and marriage in a positive way on the given scales.

Table 2 presents the subjects' responses to the twelve obstances concerned with the girls' behavior in friendship and deting. As in seen in the table, most male subjects agreed with eight statements these statements are 1, 2, 4, 5, 7, 10,

11 and 12. They disagreed with 4 ats.eachte; these statements are 5, 5, 8 and). Lost of the female subjects agreed with five statements; these statements are 2, 6, /, 10, 11 and 12. They disagreed with 7 statements; those statements are 1, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 9. The male and female subjects show significently different responses to 8 statements (1, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12).

Table 3 presents the subjects' responses to the 6 statements concerned with the coys' behavior in friendship and daring. As is seen in the table, nest note subjects agree with attractions 5, and they had a tendency to agree with attractions 2 and 3. Uset of them disagreed with attraction nest 4 and they have a tendency to disagree with attraction 1 and 6. Lest of the female subjects agree with attraction 1, 2, and 5 and they had a tendency to agree with attraction 5. Nost of their disagreed with attraction 4 and 6. The male and female subjects show eightfriently different responses to statements 1, 4, and 6.

Table 5 precents subjects' responses to five statements concerned with the relationship between the sexec and their parents. As is seen in the table, most of the male subjects agreed with statements 1 and 2, and most of them disagreed with statement 3, statement 4 and statement 5, look of the female subjects agreed with statement 2, 3, 4 and 5. The male and female subjects show significantly different responses to statement 2, statement 3 and statement 4.

Table 6 precents the percentage of the male and female subjects opinious on the age at which toys and tirls should start dating. Both male and female subjects subjects answered that the main purpose of having a girlfriend or a boyfriend is to help encourage themselves to work or equal woll.

tions on the deting behavior of boys end girls. As is seen in the table, most male and female subjects enswered that the

girl fears that her friends will think she is bad if she goes out on a date. Most of the sale subjects said that when a girl gors out on a date at night she should go alone, while the fenale subjects said that she should go out in a group. The highest percentage of the sale subjects said that girl who has a boyfriend should go out alone with another apposite sax friend if her boyfriend doesn't know and a toy who has a girlfriend should go out alone with enother apposite sax friend if he wants to. But most of the female subjects said that a girl who has a boyfriend or a boy who has a girlfriend should go out alone with another opposite said that a girl who has a boyfriend or a boy who has a girlfriend should go out alone with another opposite sax friend if she or he talls the boyfriend or girlfriend first.

Table 11 presents the male and female subjects' responses about the age at which boys and girls should nerry. As is seen in Table 13b, the highest percentage of the male and feesle subjects ensured that boys and firls sujey most the period of life when they are single without a boy-friend or girlfriend.

As is shown in Tuble 14, the highest percentage of the male and fomulo subjects answered that the boy will choose a girl whom he loves most to be his epouse and a girl should choose the boy who can be a good leader to be her spouse.

Host of the sale and female subjects answered that the income of the wife does not matter for the husband but the husband has to have a higher income than his wife. Regarding the level of education, the highest percentage of the male and female dubjects enswered that the boy should choose the Cirl who have equal education to be his wife. But the highest percentage of the male subjects answered that the level of education of the boy should not be a matter of concern for the girl in choosing her husband, while the female mubjects said that the boy with higher education than the girl should be chosen by the girl to be her husband.
