SYNOPSIS

ACTION-THRILLER

THE NET (1995)

Angela Bennett (SANDRA BULLOCK) is a computer expert. This young and beautiful analyst is never far from a computer and modem. The only activity she has outside of computers is visiting her mother. A friend, whom she's only spoken to over the net and phone, Dale Hessman (RAY MCKINNON), sent her a program with a weird glitch for her to de-bug. That night, he left to meet her and was killed in a plane crash. Angela discovers secret information on the disk she has received only hours before she leaves for vacation. Her life then turns into a nightmare, her records are erased from existence and she is given a new identity, one with a police record. She struggles to find out why this has happened and who has it in for her.

DOUBLE TEAM (1997)

Jack Quinn (JEAN-CLAUDE VAN DAMME) is persuaded to come out of retirement and resume his career as a highly skilled counter terrorist agent. His target is art dealer/terrorist Stavros (MICKEY ROURKE), a long time enemy of Quinn's. After a violent encounter with Stavros (where that man's son is killed), a wounded Quinn is taken to the "Colony," a remote island fitted with former agents. There they decipher world crists events, but can

never leave the highly protected island. Quinn slowly rebuilds his strength and manages to escape, and then enlists the help of urban arms dealer, Yaz (DENNIS RODMAN) to find Stavros. What Quinn discovers, however, is that the terrorist has taken his pregnant wife, Katherine (NATACHA LINDINGER), under his wing while planning his revenge on him.

FACE/OFF (1997)

Antiterrorism agent Sean Archer (JOHN TRAVOLTA) has been hot on the trail of Castor Troy (NICOLAS CAGE) ever since that terrorist killed his son in an assassination attempt on Sean's life. Never the same since, Sean has devoted his life to catching Castor, leaving wife Eve (JOAN ALLEN) and daughter Jamie (DOMINIQUE SWAIN) alone, both physically and emotionally for long periods of time. When Sean finally nabs his man, things seem good until they discover that Sean's brother, Pollux (ALESSANDRO NIVOLA), has planted a bomb and won't talk to anyone. So Sean surgically assumes Castor's physical appearance, but things go from bad to worse as Castor returns the favor by doing the same and then killing everyone who knows of the switch. Thus, Sean finds himself as Castor, and must do everything he can to catch Castor who's now playing the good guy. As the two then lead each other's lives, Sean uses Castor's associates, Sasha (GINA GERSHON) and Dietrich Hassler (NICK CASSAVETES), to find the terrorist, while Castor tries to eliminate Sean as he gets cozy with his family.

CONSPIRACY THEORY (1997)

Jerry Fletcher (MEL GIBSON) is a New York City cabdriver. He's also a raging paranoid with wild ideas about government controlled earthquakes, Oliver Stone, and the Vietnam war. Often telling his passengers of the many conspiracy theories that fill his head, he spends his down time spying upon Justice Department lawyer, Alice Sutton (JULIA ROBERTS), whom he earlier met while saving her from muggers. He's in love with her and she has a soft spot for him despite his many bizarre stories, his occasional visits to her office, and the fact that she really thinks he's crazy. After he has a close encounter with Dr. Jonas (PATRICK STEWART), a mysterious government agent who tries to interrogate Jerry, Alice is surprised to find that many government agencies are also looking for him. Still reeling over the unsolved murder of her father, she soon begins to believe Jerry's convoluted stories that slowly being to involve that murder. As more covert government people get involved, including Agent Lowry (CYLK COZART), Alice must do what she can to help Jerry who's now the subject of a massive government manhunt.

ENEMY OF THE STATE (1998)

Robert Clayton Dean (WILL SMITH) is a Washington, DC-based labor lawyer hoping to expose a local mobster, Pintero (TOM SIZEMORE). With evidence supplied by his informant contact, Rachel Banks (LISA BONET), Dean puts the squeeze on the thug who, in turn, threatens him unless he confesses to his informant's identity.

Meanwhile, a high-ranking NSA official, Thomas Reynolds (JON VOIGHT), who's tired of haggling with a Congressman (JASON ROBARDS) opposed to a new surveillance bill, has that man killed. Unbeknownst until later to Reynolds and his small hit squad, a hidden bird watching camera has captured the whole event on videotape.

When they discover that the camera's owner, nature photographer Daniel Zavitz (JASON LEE), is preparing to take it to the press, Reynolds has his thugs go after him. During a citywide chase, Zavitz happens to run into Dean and secretly places that video into the lawyer's shopping bags.

Learning that this has occurred, Reynolds and his right-hand man, Agent Hicks (LOREN DEAN) send a group of covert operatives, including Krug (JAKE BUSEY), Pratt (BARRY PEPPER), Jones (SCOTT CAAN), Fiedler (JACK BLACK) and Jamie (JAMIE KENNEDY), to discover what Dean may know about the video. In the process, they destroy his life by having him lose his job, his credit, and his wife, Carla (REGINA KING), who worries when she receives pictures of him and Rachel, his former girlfriend and lover from a recent affair, together.

As Dean goes to her for help, he finds that she's in the same predicament, but also learns of her enigmatic informant, Brill (GENE HACKMAN), a former intelligence operative, whom she's never met. Eventually figuring out that Pintero isn't responsible for his life being upended, Dean then realizes that Brill may be the only person able to help him. Once the two finally meet, the

unlikely partners set out to clear their names and do what they can to turn the tables on Reynolds.

THE MATRIX (1999)

Neo (KEANU REEVES), a.k.a. Thomas Anderson, is a computer programmer by day and illegal hacker by night. He's recently been contacted by a mysterious woman named Trinity (CARRIE-ANNE MOSS) who informs him of something called "The Matrix," a mysterious entity of which he's vaguely familiar. That action leads to her near arrest by Agent Smith (HUGO WEAVING) and his government type thugs but she manages to escape. Now that they know about Neo, however, Smith and his team are hot on his trail.

To his aide comes Morpheus (LAURENCE FISHBURNE), an enigmatic cyber terrorist who's number one on Smith's most wanted list. Morpheus gets him out, but then drops a bombshell into Neo's world. It turns out that everything Neo has experienced in his life has just been an illusion created by the Matrix, a device employed by a powerful and intelligent, but mechanized and artificial life form that's using enslaved, unaware humans as its power source.

Joining Morpheus and his small team, which includes Trinity, Cypher (JOE PANTOLIANO) and a handful of other characters, Neo learns that he may be the chosen one to overthrow the artificial life form. After Morpheus trains Neo of the ways of the Matrix, he and the rest of the team return to that artificial, dreamlike world where dying in a battle with Agent Smith and his men means certain death back in the real, outside world.

HORROR

LITTLE WITCHES (1996)

When an old school building is being restored, the secret baptism room is discovered. It is said to be the place where the Illuminatis, the Satan group, held the ritual. The six naughty Catholic schoolgirls are curious about this group, and then they start to conjure up the devil from an ancient book of spells they found under the old statue, causing the tragic death of the innocent people.

SCREAM (1996)

The killings begin when a teenager, Casey Becker (DREW BARRYMORE), is terrorized and then killed by a phone caller with a penchant for horror movies. Sidney Prescott (NEVE CAMPBELL) becomes the next recipient of the calls and this spooks her since it's nearly the one year anniversary of her mother's brutal slaying. Her boyfriend Bill (SKEET ULRICH), thinks she's overreacting, but her friend Tatum Riley (Rose McGowan) and Deputy Dewey Riley (DAVID ARQUETTE) think differently. Intrigued by the possibility of a pending murder spree, tabloid TV reporter Gale Weathers (COURTENEY COX) jumps on the scene hoping to increase sales of her upcoming book about the man in prison for Sidney's mother's death. Sidney has no idea who the killer is, but several suspects loom about her as she tries to escape several encounters with the figure.

I KNOW WHAT YOU DID LAST SUMMER (1997)

It's the summer after high school for four North Carolina friends. Julie James (JENNIFER LOVE HEWITT), the smart one, is dating Ray Bronson (FREDDIE PRINZE JR.), the son of a local fisherman. Helen Shivers (SARAH MICHELLE GELLAR) has just won a local beauty pageant and hopes to become an actress while her boyfriend, Barry Cox (RYAN PHILLIPPE), is a snobbish, spoiled rich kid. Their future seems bright until one night they accidentally hit and kill a man with their car. Scared that the police will charge them for drunken manslaughter, the guys convince the ladies that they'll dispose of the body and never tell anyone of their secret. A year then passes, and the guilt of their deed has fractured their friendship. They're brought together again, however, after they begin getting notes and other signs that someone knows what they did last summer. They begin to investigate the possibilities, and discover many suspects, such as Max (JOHNNY GALECKI), another teen who drove by the initial accident scene, and Melissa Egan (ANNE HECHE), the dead man's creepy sister. As the anniversary of their deed approaches, the foursome finds themselves confronting a violent killer intent upon enacting revenge for the man's death.

I'VE BEEN WAITING FOR YOU (1998)

When a California teen (Sarah Chalke) with an interest in the occult moves to a New England town, she finds that the town teens believe she is a witch sent to seek revenge on the descendents of the people who originally killed another witch a hundred years earlier. Things take a particularly deadly turn when they convince her to play a seer at a Halloween party where they will feed her information over an earphone about those who enter her tent, only she suddenly sees things beyond their knowledge or help.

DISTURBING BEHAVIOR (1998)

After the suicide of his older brother, Steve Clark (JAMES MARSDEN) and his family — parents Nathan (TERRY DAVID MULLIGAN) and Cynthia (SUSAN HOGAN) and younger sister Lindsay (KATHARINE ISABELLE) — move to the pleasantly quaint town of Cradle Bay.

Attending the local high school, Steve meets stoner Gavin Strick (NICK STAHL) and his albino buddy, U.V. (CHAD E. DONELLA) who quickly inform Steve of the school's class system, where the "Blue Ribbons" — the most popular and successful students — rule over the geeks, motorheads, and other assorted cliques.

Having witnessed one of the Blue Ribbons kill several people but not be arrested by the town's head cop, Officer Cox (STEVE RAILSBACK), Gavin knows something weird is happening, but no one, including Steve, believes his paranoid sounding story. Besides, Steve is more interested in Gavin's loner friend, Rachel Wagner (KATIE HOLMES).

Unfortunately, Chug Roman (A.J. BUCKLEY), one of the Blue Ribbons, is also interested in Rachel, a fact that doesn't endear him to the group, although she wants nothing to do with Chug or them. Steve also notices the odd behavior of the Blue Ribbons, and gets suspicious when the school

psychiatrist, Dr. Caldicott (BRUCE GREENWOOD), encourages him to join the elitist group.

After Gavin suddenly and surprisingly becoming a Blue Ribbon and as more violent events occur and more mysterious behavior unfolds, Steve and Rachel discover the technologically sinister truth behind the Blue Ribbons. With the aide of Dorian Newberry (WILLIAM SADLER), the school's enigmatic janitor, Steve and Rachel attempt to stop Caldicott and the group while avoiding becoming Blue Ribbons themselves.

URBAN LEGEND (1998)

After the brutal murder of a fellow classmate, Michelle Mancini (NATASHA GREGSON WAGNER), the students of Pendleton College -- recently named the safest university in the country -- are a bit unnerved. That's because Paul (JARED LETO), an aggressive investigative journalist for the school paper, has printed a story about a homicidal lunatic being loose on the campus, a fact that doesn't sit well with Dean Adams (JOHN NEVILLE), or Reese (LORETTA DEVINE), the head of campus security.

None of that is helped by American Folklore Professor Wexler (ROBERT ENGLUND) and his class on urban legends. While he tries to debunk the stories of the person in the back seat of a car, the killer making telephone calls from inside the babysitter's house, and mixing Pop Rocks and Pepsi, one of his students, Natalie (ALICIA WITT), begins to get nervously suspicious regarding such incidents.

When a friend of hers, Damon (JOSHUA JACKSON), is killed in front of her eyes by a mysteriously hooded stranger, Natalie tries reporting the incident to the authorities, but they don't believe her. Her manic-depressive roommate, Tosh (DANIELLE HARRIS) is of no use to her, and her friends Brenda (REBECCA GAYHEART), who has a thing for Paul, and Parker (MICHAEL ROSENBAUM), who's dating Sasha (TARA REID), the host of a college radio sex advice show, believe that Damon — a known practical joker — was just pulling one over on her.

As more people are killed in ways copying the various urban legends she's heard about, however, Natalie tries to figure out the identity of the killer while attempting to warn others of the impending danger facing them.
