Following some of the definitions of the "Middle-Class Bangkokians" at Chapter 5 of this Thesis, Mr. Teruki Ishida is known to be a "*Middle – Class Bangkokian*" in terms of the "5-year age and sex" Class groups as well as his living region. His age is not too high, not too low as could be seen in any population pyramids in the range of 15 to 64 years old. The National Statistical Office in Thailand includes "foreigners residing over 3 months in the Kingdom of Thailand" as the "Thai residents of alien nationals", and he is therefore counted as one of the Bangkok people in Thai society according to the Thai census source.

Nevertheless he was born in Japan, and he is a Japanese student studying at MA course in Thai Studies at the time of this Vita writing.
